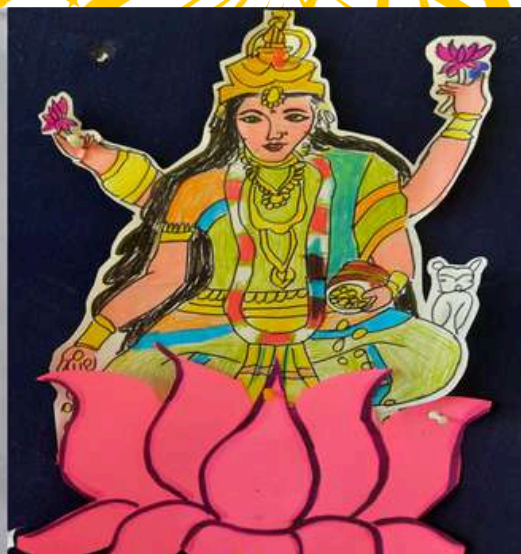


Vision of the Month

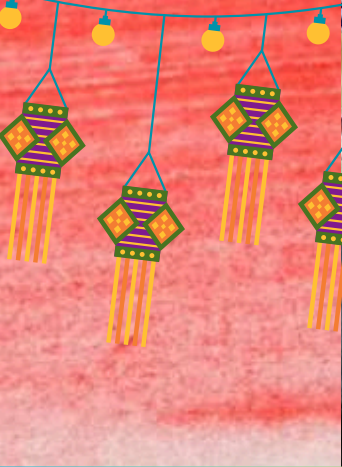
Parents Teacher Meeting

Joy of Giving



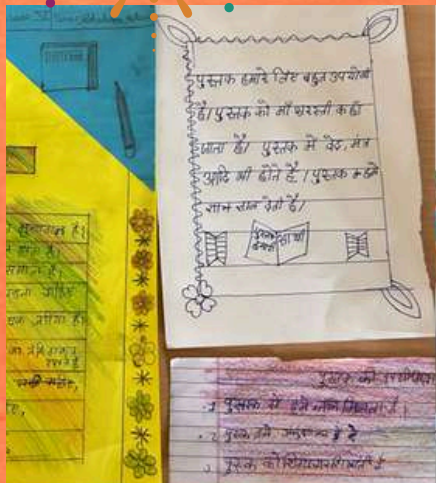

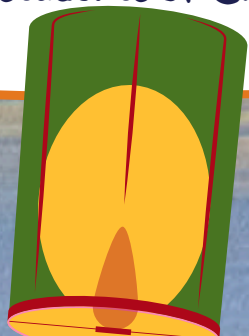




DIWALI CELEBRATION
